
- Cohort of 7th Grade students that attend monthly trips to the Cradle of Aviation Museum
- The students engage in hands on STEM activities centered around aeronautics and space



VAP/ AP/ Research

In addition to our Regents and Advanced Classes, WWHS has been able to expand upon its previous programming to provide opportunities in the field of Research, Engineering and Computer Science.

Research- currently a 4 year program with 55 students. We maintain a partnership with Syracuse University for college credit at the 3rd and 4th year. Currently students are working closely with both the Brookhaven and Cold Spring Laboratories.


<u>Computer Science</u>- With the addition of the Cybersecurity lab we currently run the following courses: Intro to Computer Science, AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, Cyber Security.

Engineering- We have recently partnered with Stony Brook University with our Principles of Engineering course. We also have expanded Robotics, AP Physics and AP Physics 2.

AP CAPSTONE

- AP Capstone™ is a diploma program from the College Board.
 It's based on two year long AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. Rather than teaching subject-specific content, these courses develop students' skills in research, analysis, evidence-based arguments, collaboration, writing, and presenting.
- Currently WWHS offers 30 AP courses and 25 College level courses offerings from institutions such as Stony Brook, Molloy, Farmingdale, Syracuse, Suffolk Community and Saint Johns.
