- This course follows the seventh and eighth grade curriculum, engaging students in the Integrated Co-Teaching Setting in a blocked schedule setting ( 90 minutes of instruction every other day)

## VAP/ AP/ Research

In addition to our Regents and Advanced Classes, WWHS has been able to expand upon its previous programming to provide opportunities in the field of Research, Engineering and Computer Science.
Research- currently a 4 year program with 55 students. We maintain a partnership with Syracuse University for college credit at the 3rd and 4th year. Currently students are working closely with both the Brookhaven and Cold Spring Laboratories.
Computer Science- With the addition of the Cybersecurity lab we currently run the following courses: Intro to Computer Science, AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, Cyber Security.
Engineering- We have recently partnered with Stony Brook University with our Principles of Engineering course. We also have expanded Robotics, AP Physics and AP Physics 2.

## AP CAPSTONE

- AP Capstone ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ is a diploma program from the College Board. It's based on two year long AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. Rather than teaching subject-specific content, these courses develop students' skills in research, analysis, evidence-based arguments, collaboration, writing, and presenting.
- Currently WWHS offers 30 AP courses and 25 College level courses offerings from institutions such as Stony Brook, Molloy, Farmingdale, Syracuse, Suffolk Community and Saint Johns.

## AP Highlights

1. The total number of exams taken by Hispanic students has risen by $38 \%$ over the last 5 years.
a. 2015-122 AP tests taken by Hispanic students with a 57\% pass rate (3 or higher)
b. 2019-194 AP tests taken by Hispanic students with a 70\% pass rate (3 or higher)
2. The total number of Black students taking AP exams has risen by $\mathbf{4 0 \%}$ over the last 5 years
a. 2015-45 AP tests taken by Black students with a $57 \%$ pass rate ( 3 or higher)
b. 2019-74 AP tests taken by Black students with a $73 \%$ pass rate ( 3 or higher)
3. In 2019 10\% of students taking AP exams are classified with either an IEP or 504 plan.
4. The total number of exams taken by low income students has risen by $82 \%$ over the last 5 years a. 2015-163 AP tests taken by Low Income students with a $57 \%$ pass rate ( 3 or higher)
b. 2019-909 AP tests taken by Low Income students with a 72\% pass rate (3 or higher)
5. As we continue to increase the number of exams and students participating in AP courses, our student passing rate has remained over $70 \%$ over the last 3 years. This percentage is over the state and global (national) average.
