## Goals of WWHS 9 Period Day

- To incorporate a 9 period day schedule at Walt Whitman High School for the purpose of providing the necessary support and engagement to students of all learning levels, giving our students the opportunity to excel.


## A History Lesson

- The last school year during which Walt Whitman High School maintained a 9-period schedule was 2010/2011. In that year there were approximately 1,896 students in the building. The Master Schedule listed 152 teachers and approximately 257 different courses offered. Note: There were 40 ICT sections. 1100 study hall seats.
- We currently (2023-2024) have approximately 2,028 students in the building. The Master Schedule lists 167 teachers and approximately 290 different courses offered. Note: There are currently 70 ICT sections. 349 study hall seats.
