



- Virtual services & remote learning support





- Application
- College Essay
 - Supplemental Essays*
- Official HS Transcript
- Official SAT/ACT Scores
- Recommendation Letters
- Resume/Activities List
- Special Requirements*



How Applications are Evaluated

- Holistic review process
- Hard Factors
 - GPA/Grades
 - Test Scores (SAT/ACT)
- Soft Factors
 - Essays
 - Resume/Activities List
 - Recommendation Letters
 - Demonstrated Interest





Throughout High School



- Take college-prep courses
 - Develop core subjects
- Focus on grades
- Participate in clubs and/or sports
 - Consider leadership positions
- Find volunteer or job opportunities
- Start saving for college
 - Apply for outside scholarships



Junior & Senior Year Timelines

A to-do list.

Junior Year

Now - September

- ✓ Visit colleges & universities in-person or virtually!
- Request information and do research
- ✓ Track important dates
- Determine academic spectrum
- Request letter(s) of recommendation

- Consider school testing requirements or test-optional admissions
- ✓ Prepare for the SATs and/or ACTs
- ✔ Prepare college essay
- ✓ Update resume
- Schedule interviews (if desired)



Senior Year

September - December

- ✓ Take ACT and/or SAT exams
- Proofread and finalize college essay
- Track important dates and deadlines
- Engage in opportunities to demonstrate interest

- Prepare applications and supplemental forms
- Research scholarship opportunities
- Maintain strong grades
- ✓ File the FAFSA using prior-prior year data (October 1st)



Senior Year

January - March

- Request and/or send midyear reports
- Maintain grades
- Research scholarship opportunities
- ✔ Follow up with each school's admissions office
- ✔ Follow up with each school's financial aid office
- ✔ Plan for spring events



- Distance
- Regional and topic-specific receptions with parents & alumni
- Visit schools AGAIN
 - In-person and virtual opportunities
 - Sit in on classes
 - Campus and virtual tours
 - Accepted Student Days
 - Outcomes & statistics





Investigate Further...



- Wander around campus
- Browse in the college bookstore
- Walk/drive around the community
- Listen to the college's radio station/podcast(s)
- Eat in the cafeteria
- Read the student newspaper
- Follow social media accounts
- Talk to current students



Senior Year

April - June

- ✓ Re-read all documents
- Attend final events
- Make final decision
 - ✓ (Deadline: May 1)
- ✓ Notify all schools
- Waitlisted? Respond accordingly.

- ✔ Final transcript mailed to school
- Summer planning
- Orientation
- ✔ Registration for classes
- ✓ Finalize financial aid
