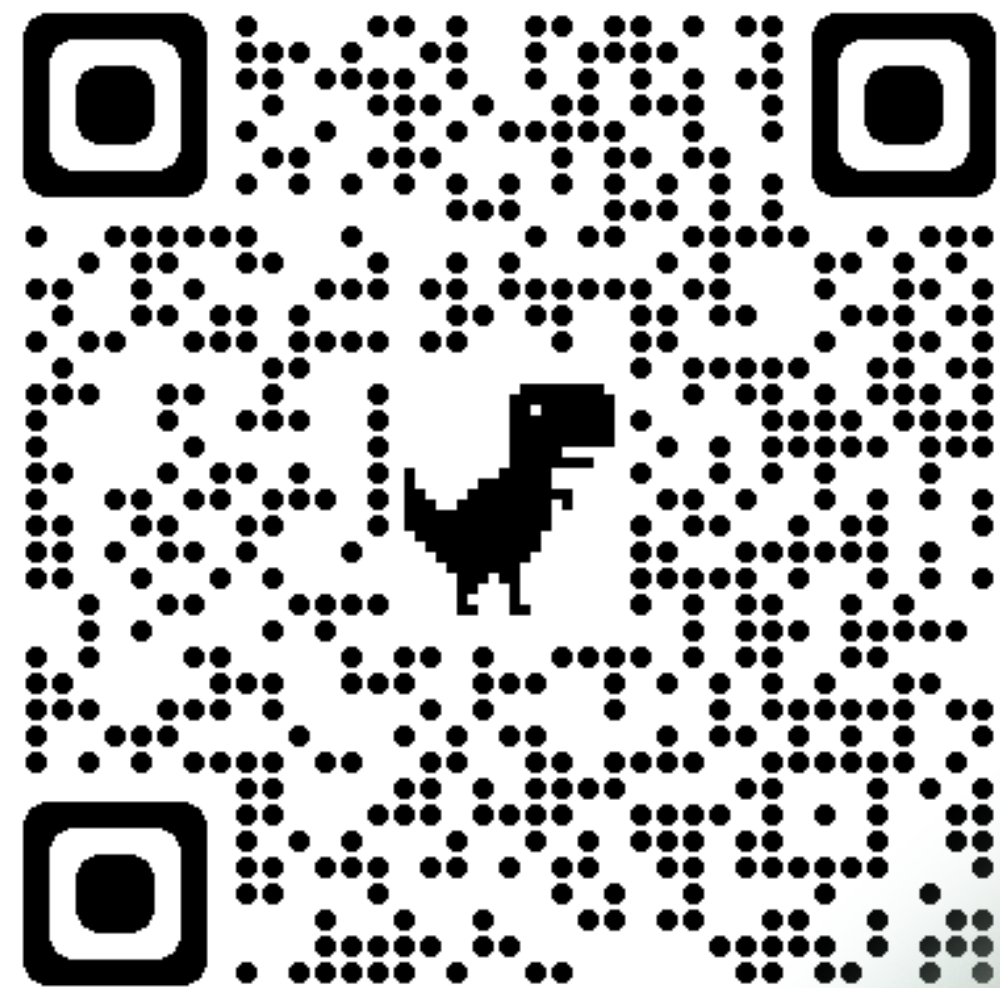

Student Portal


The student portal is a great resource to check grades, assignments, and projects. If you can't access it, you can email Mrs. Downey (sdowney@shufsd.org)

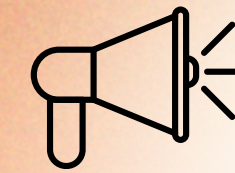
