School budgeting is similar to home budgeting in that it consists of the comparison between anticipated revenues and expenditures.

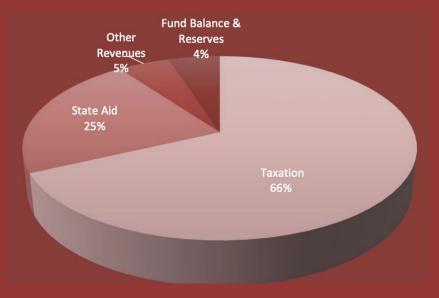

# **FACILITIES PLANNING**

- In 2021-22 the district allocated approximately \$780,000 for the continued maintenance of buildings and grounds, as well as \$3,170,000 in "Transfer to Capital" for necessary repairs and renovations, in addition to targeted Capital Projects

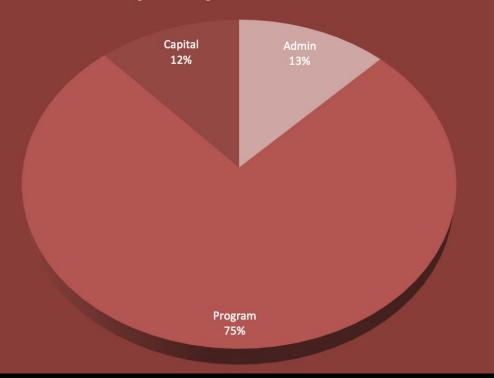

# **FOUNDATION AID**

- Foundation Aid was created in 2007 and takes school district wealth and student need into account to create an equitable distribution of state funding to schools.
- It is the most substantial aid category supporting public schools.
- Often due to the State's financial challenges, South Huntington was significantly <u>under</u> funded.
- There is now a commitment from the State legislature to fully fund the district's Foundation Aid by 2023/24.

# **EXPENSE-BASED AID**

Expense-based aid is received based on our prior year expenditures.

 This is based on categories such as Transportation, BOCES, Building Aid and Instructional Materials Aid.

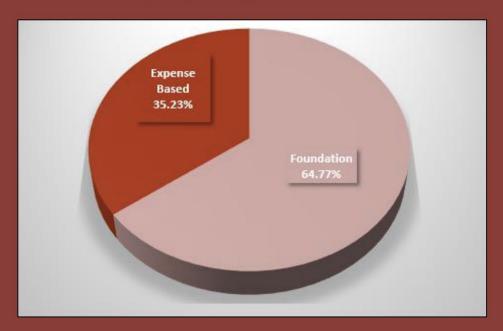
# **2022/23 PROPOSED STATE AID**

- The Governor's Executive Budget proposes \$58,622,324 in total aid for 2022/23.
- This would be a total aid increase of \$12,231,638 (26.37 %) based upon the current estimates of 2021-2022 Base Year Aids.
- The majority of this increase would come from Foundation Aid.

# 2022/23 PROPOSED STATE AID BREAKDOWN

• Foundation Aid: \$37,971,444

• Expense-Based Aid: \$20,650,880



# EXPECTED 2022/2023 COSTS

- Pension System Rates:
  - a. ERS 11.60% (currently 16.20%)
  - b. TRS Estimated range 10.00 10.50% (currently 9.80%)
- Healthcare cost challenges (increasing 13%):
   Schools have to project the second half of the school year
- Utility costs are increasing at approximately 6%
