AP, Engineering & Research Courses



Engineering/Computer Science/Research Programs

In addition to our Regents and Advanced Classes, WWHS has been able to expand upon its previous programming to provide opportunities in the fields of Research, Engineering and Computer Science.

Research - Currently a 4-year program with 64 students. We maintain a partnership with Syracuse University for college credit at the 3rd and 4th year. Currently students are working closely with both the Brookhaven and Cold Spring Laboratories.

Computer Science - With the addition of the Cybersecurity lab, we currently run the following courses: Intro to Computer Science, AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, Cyber Security.

Engineering - We have recently partnered with Stony Brook University with our Principles of Engineering course. We also have expanded Robotics, AP Physics and AP Physics 2.

AP CAPSTONE

AP Capstone™ is a diploma program from the College Board started in 2019. It's based on two year-long AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. Rather than teaching subject-specific content, these courses develop students' skills in research, analysis, evidence-based arguments, collaboration, writing, and presenting.

- **In 2020, WWHS had 8 students achieve a Capstone diploma**
- **In 2021, WWHS had 10 students achieve a Capstone diploma**
- **In 2022, WWHS potentially has 29 students achieving a Capstone diploma**

College Coursework at WWHS

Currently WWHS offers 30 AP courses and 26 College-level course offerings from institutions such as Stony Brook, Molloy, Farmingdale, Syracuse, Suffolk Community and St. John's.
