





i-Ready Testing - Benefits/Parent Portal Students in Grades K-8 are continuing with the i-Ready Reading and Math Diagnostic Assessments. The testing window will close on Feb-ruary 4th. All schools have designated times for each class to take the diagnostic during the assigned testing window. The data received from this diagnostic assessment provides teachers with valuable in-formation regarding each student's academic progress, which is used to influence and individualize instruction. Student performance on this assessment will dictate their lessons and learning while using the My Path Individualized Instructional tool. This along with class-room assignments and other benchmark assessments provide us room assignments and other benchmark assessments provide us with data from various resources that help to create an informative and well-rounded curricular path for each child. i-Ready results will be available on the Parent Portal after the testing window is closed. Please note that the testing window may be extended to accommodate any make-ups needed.

Congratulations to all the great teams that participated in the SW-SMS Dodgeball Tournament last Saturday - - great teamwork made a wonderful day for everyone!



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

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

Last week our students took their Winter i-Ready Diagnostic. Staff



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



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
