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

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

News from Assistant Superintendent for Business and District Operations Dr. Vito D'Elia

The new year signals important things for education, as local school districts begin developing the spending plans that will be presented to the voters for approval in May. The extensive budgeting process kicks off each year with the Governor's Executive Spending proposal, which serves as a bottom line number in each district's revenue allocations. Typically, the Executive Budget is revealed in January, and line-by-line district allocations are examined before local legislatures advocate bringing more funds home to their specific districts. Of course, the budget development process shifts accordingly as the state-aid allocations are adjusted, and a final package is developed to fund operations. We are guardedly optimistic with the first Executive Proposal, as the number seems to increase our district's aid by approximately 5%. Of course, the NYS funding is critically important this year, given the millions of dollars of COVID spending and historically low anticipated tax. Of course, we will now embark upon a "full court advocacy press," and work to make sure that maximum available resources are directed to our South Huntington District.

Some Thoughts from Assistant Superintendent for Student Services April Poprilo

We just wanted to provide a gentle reminder for parents and staff to copy the school administrations on any evening or weekend reports of positive COVID infections. Copying the building team increases the likelihood that the alert will be quickly noticed regardless of the late hour and swift and accurate precautionary action can be taken.

News from Dr. James Wright, Supervisor of Physical Education, Health, Athletics & Recreation

Late Friday afternoon, the Governor announced that Interscholastic Athletics will be allowed to proceed in New York State, provided that local health departments are comfortable with the regional plans. While there are still a great deal of details and specifics to be arranged, we are excited by the news, and will make sure that our student athletes and coaches are fully prepared when the games begin. 

This week Stimson will be administering the iReady Assessments in both Math and Reading. All students will be participating (both virtual and hybrid). Students will take the Reading Assessment










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on Tuesday and Wednesday, and the Math Assessment on Thursday and Friday. Please do not hesitate to contact us with any questions.

If you have not returned your child's Emergency Dismissal Form, please do so as soon as possible. It is important that in case of an

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
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

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
A Message from the Board of Education

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
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News from SEPTA – Maureen Basedow
