### **News from Sheila's Food Corner**



Many questions arise when discussing the School Nutrition Program because it is unlike any other district service that keeps South Huntington running smoothly each school day! The questions are important, and I felt it worthwhile on a monthly basis to tackle one commonly asked question at a time.

### How is the District's School Nutrition Program (SNP) financed?

The SNP is not financed through the general school budget that is voted upon each May. The May school budget vote is for the General Fund (G Fund). The nutrition program runs from a separate Fund (C Fund). Monies are not received from the yearly school budget vote. The SNP is its own "small business," with four main sources of income. They are comprised of: Federal Reimbursement, State Reimbursement, monies from students buying lunch with cash and adult/student catering events. In order to receive Federal or State Reimbursements, our program must follow the National School Lunch Program, which was established in 1946 by President Truman. The main focus of the act is to provide a nutritionally-balanced, low cost or free lunch to our children each school day.

There are many financial restrictions when following this program which makes our days challenging and yet rewarding.

\*The Federal/State reimbursement monies we receive are % amounts derived for each child that participates in our program. The % amount is set each year by the government.

\*If our program ends up with a profit at the end of a school year, we are restricted to "holding" no more than 3-months profit from one school year to the next without written documentation to the State. This documentation must provide reasoning for how the excess money will be spent (i.e., kitchen equipment).


\*The program cannot lose money on a continuous basis.

\*The daily student lunch prices are regulated by NYS. If we raise the

















cost from year-to-year, it is because NYS feels we cannot be solvent otherwise.

\*The foods we serve our children must be nutritious and appealing to purchase (as parents know, nutritious items tend to be the most expensive, i.e., produce).

It is a challenge to not lose money, but also not to make too much money! A balancing act we work through carefully each school year.




### News from Mr. Eddie Smith, Principal of Stimson Middle School
