First and foremost, we would like to wish a very happy Custodial Workers day to all of the dedicated men and women who keep our students and staff safe, warm, and secure each and every day. We are incredibly fortunate to have such special people caring for the members of our learning family.

It's hard to believe that September is behind us, and we are already into our second month of school. It certainly wasn't a traditional opening, but we made it through and instruction is up and running in each school. We are incredibly grateful for all of your cooperation and patience and are receiving largely positive feedback regarding our safety protocols and instructional models. We realize that there are many who are hoping that students, especially at the elementary level, can return in increasing numbers. However, we are committed to investigating the potential for enhanced instruction, and equally committed to doing this correctly with methodical thinking and careful planning, as we did with the September opening. So the next several weeks will be dedicated to planning, and in order to do this correctly, we ask that you respond to any of our e-mail information requests in a timely manner.

News from Your Nutrition Department



WELCOME BACK!!

The 2020-2021 school year has begun with many changes! Our children have different options in how/where they learn....in-person classroom learning or virtually from home. This new format gives the Nutrition Department different options in how/where we feed our children, as well.

What do we need to remember about School Nutrition in times such as this?



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<u>Food safety is our top priority.</u> The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the World Health Organization (WHO) all stress that there is no evidence COVID-19 spreads via food or food packaging. Whether meals are served in school or at a grab-and-go pick-up location, school meal preparation is conducted in strict adherence with federal, state and local food safety regulations. In addition, CDC and FDA procedures are in place to protect school nutrition staff and the students they serve, including the use of Personal Protective Equipment, additional cleaning of food preparation and service areas, regular training on proper hygiene practices and food safety measures.

<u>Healthy food fuels students with learning</u>. This is why school meals continue to meet strict federal nutrition standards during the pandemic. It is our job to develop delicious meals that meet federal regulations that are safely served to students whether they are dining in the cafeteria, or picking up their meals to eat at home.

How are we feeding our children during these different times?

Our youngest children are being provided "room service" to their individual classrooms. Both breakfast and lunch meals are brought to the child's classroom in individually wrapped portions. This new method of serving, although not as "socially fun" for our children, does provide the safety that we, as coordinators of the program, feel necessary. In addition, all utensils, condiments, etc., are pre-wrapped to ensure proper safety measures have been taken.

Our middle and high school students are being served following a few different methods. Some are served in the traditional serving lines, while others at our "grab and go" kiosks. Each option is designed to keep social distancing in place.

Our Hybrid children are also given the opportunity to take food home to enjoy on the days that they are learning remotely. Our virtual students are able to pick up meals from Stimson every day at a designated location. This option has turned out to be more successful than we had originally planned!

This year every meal serving option has the same theme, "We bring the food to the kids instead of them coming to us." We will do whatever is necessary to make sure that our children have the opportunity to enjoy breakfast and lunch with us regardless the teaching format!

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
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Counseling Center News

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



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
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News from Dr. Gayle Steele, Principal of Maplewood Intermediate School

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
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


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News from Mr. Mitchell Levy, Principal of Countrywood Primary Center

It is with this understanding that we salute and applaud your efforts. Our community is better with each of you working on its behalf—and together, we will be stronger because of your energy and strength.


