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


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OUR MEALS COME TO YOU!!

Visuals are often a good way to show our families how the School Nutrition Program works to make our children's meals more accessible. New school procedures led to new ways to serve our students. Each building has found a way to bring meals to the children in a safe, secure way. Our youngest are being served in the classrooms from rolling carts that contain their hot and cold meal items. Bright blue/red bags are rolled into each classroom containing designated children's meals. The thermal bags keep the foods at correct temperatures during the transport.

As the students get older, we have created Kiosks in different locations throughout the buildings to keep the amount of student clustering to a minimum. Our remote learners have been given new/different options for enjoying our meals. We have started using Bento boxes!

We continue to introduce new/different ideas that allow our students with great meals to enjoy.



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

username will be the 9-digit student ID, plus first initial, last initial (lower case)

password will be the 6-digit student birthday, plus first initial, last initial (lower case)

the student will be prompted to change their password the first time they log in.

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

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

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
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News from Dr. Annie Michaelian, Principal of Oakwood Primary Center

Especially during this difficult time, having such a sincere expression of appreciation of public service was truly beyond words, and we thank everyone involved in making the evening one to remember!


