It's amazing what a group of middle school children can do when they put their minds to it!

Regardless of what the final leaderboard says, there really are no losers in Penny Wars. We raised a lot of money, which will benefit Stimson and a charity or charities chosen by the winning team. A substantial food donation will be made to St. Hugh's, which will help to feed families in the Huntington area. Some food items will be used to make Thanksgiving baskets, which will be distributed to South Huntington families in need. Additionally, our military items and water bottles will be donated to Long Island Blue Stars Moms who will use them to send care packages to our service men and women who are stationed overseas. Legos will be used to make creative spaces right here at Stimson, with some Legos being donated to other schools in the district. And, of course, those Box Tops will bring in some additional revenue for the school. In short, everybody wins! The students and staff had some fun and learned the value of teamwork. The school will benefit and the community will benefit.



News from Dr. Annie Michaelian, Principal of Oakwood Primary Center


