News from Deputy Superintendent Dr. Joseph Centamore in the Curriculum Office

Over the past two years, the South Huntington K-5 elementary math committee met to discuss how to best support our elementary students in learning mathematics. After researching many math programs, visiting other school districts, listening to presentations from different companies, and doing an extensive pilot, the committee ultimately recommended Ready Classroom Mathematics (RCM). With support from the district's Curriculum Council and Board of Education, the district adopted this research-based program that promotes students to become independent thinkers and is aligned to the iReady diagnostic assessment that all our students take three times each year.

In May, our teachers received professional development focused on implementing RCM. Throughout this school year, our teachers and administrators continue to receive coaching from trained professionals focused on using RCM to support our students both remotely and in-person effectively. We will continue to receive professional development over the next few years to ensure our students are independent thinkers and have a solid foundation for success in their mathematical education.

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

News from Mr. Steve Toto, Principal of Silas Wood Sixth-Grade School




Congratulations to our second set of Silas Superstars of School Year 2020-2021!

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

Social Emotional Learning in Homes & Communities

Social and emotional learning starts at home. Parents and families are critical partners in helping their children develop social and emotional knowhow. They can model the kinds of skills, attitudes, and behaviors we want all students to master. This week, members of our Social Emotional building team began visiting classrooms and reading to the children. Classrooms discussions centered on the theme of emotional regulation using the book, *Ish*, by Peter H. Reynolds. Our SEL Team will collaborate with the entire Birchwood staff so that we can continue to focus on the emotional well-being of our students and help them manage these challenging times. The following is a list of resources that focus on the role of parents and parenting in social and emotional learning (SEL).

Websites:

Parentingchangemakers.org: Offers resources with a focus on building four skills in family life: empathy, teamwork, new leadership, and change-making. The process helps parent's problem-solve for them and leads families and communities in addressing the issues that are most pressing to them. Commonsensemedia.org: Reviews movies, apps, video games, and other media available to children. Each movie, for example, lists a parent-level age rating, along with a kid's perspective of the appropriate age level. Confidentparentsconfidentkids.org: The only site for parents that focuses explicitly on actively promoting kids' social, emotional, and ethical devel-

opment.

<u>Greatschools.org</u>: A community resource to find and share information about schools. You can type in any school, city, or zip code and get demo-





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graphic information on schools in your area such as ratings, reviews, and extracurricular. The video series "Milestones" describes grade-level expectations in K-5, including children's perspectives. The site has an "Emotional Smarts" section with a toolbox, a game, and a video series.

<u>Healthychildren.org</u>: Developed by the American Academy of Pediatrics, this site provides information on children's developmental ages and stages, healthy living practices, safety and prevention, and dealing with health concerns at home.

Infoaboutkids.org: This site is committed to publishing resources with a solid research base. It has sections on body, mind, emotions, and relationships. Mindbrainparenting.org: Designed for ages 5 to adult, the cards cover six categories (self-awareness; relationship skills; self-management; social awareness; responsible decision making; and diversity, equity, and inclusion) and ask questions such as, what is fairness? What is luck? They can be used in a multitude of ways — as conversation prompts during dinner or daily errands, or in place of playing cards in a game of Go Fish.

<u>Parenttoolkit.com</u>: Provides developmental markers at each age/stage, with guidance for parents on how to support each aspect of development. Resources include the areas of academic, health and wellness, and social and emotional development.

<u>StopBullying.gov</u>: Focused on helping parents, educators, and community members stop bullying. There are also resources and articles targeting kids and teens.

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
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
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meals for all families. Please be sure to register early if you wish to have the meal kits ready for your family.
