News from Deputy Superintendent Dr. Joseph Centamore in the Curriculum Office

On Saturday, January 30th, teams from districts across Long Island competed in the Prestigious Department of Energy Science Bowl, sponsored by Brookhaven National Laboratory. Our Whitman team practiced throughout the fall and winter under the direction of Science Bowl Coach Erin Roche. In Saturday's regional competition, Whitman team members, **Joshua Alms**, **Ryan Rowe, Ethan Shapiro, Mathew Kerner**, and **Ira Dubey** answered high-level questions in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth and Space, and Mathematics. The competition was fully virtual this year, adding a new layer of complexity to the already highly challenging competition. The Office of Energy's National Science Bowl is one of the nation's largest science competitions. We thank our students and coach for their hard work, and look forward to next year's competition!

Led by music teacher and theater director, Mr. Slawitsky, the elementary intermediate-level, after school virtual theater workshop program for Birchwood and Maplewood, begins this week for Grade 3. Grade 4 begins the week of March 1st, and Grade 5, the week of March 22nd. Birchwood students will virtually meet on Tuesdays, and Maplewood students on Thursdays. Each grade will have a three-week mini-session. Students are assigned to virtual groups, where during a twenty-five minute workshop, they will perform acting exercises and commercial scene-like readings providing them with a fun and exciting exposure to the theatrical arts!




News from Mr. Anthony Ciccarelli, Principal of Birchwood Intermediate School
