school year calendar, with the first day of classes scheduled for Tuesday, September 1, 2020. Second, the Board approved donations from Mathnasium and the Rockefeller Group. We thank each of these companies for their generosity and commitment to South Huntington. Third, the Board approved various travel, including an important trip to Albany to meet with elected officials in the NYS Legislature to advocate on behalf of our District for more state aid.

After our new business was concluded, the Board received a Facilities Committee report and accepted the recommendations of the Committee with respect to summer construction projects. Specifically, the District plans to convert the property that it acquired adjacent to Stimson into hundreds of additional parking spaces, renovate the WWHS Forum, and construct a new field at Memorial where our Girls Softball team will play and practice. These exciting projects will benefit our students and staff for years to come. Additionally, the Board agreed to list three properties on the market -- the Teen Center, the current softball field behind Staples, and vacant land near the District Office. The proceeds of the sale of these properties would be used to improve the District's infrastructure and enhance the safety of our buildings.

As we turn the calendar to February, the budget planning process for the 2020-21 school year will kick into high gear. To that end, we invite you to join us at the next Board of Education meeting on February 26th at the James Kaden Administrative Offices for a budget overview presentation. We hope to see you there.
