

News from Deputy Superintendent Dr. Joseph Centamore in the Curriculum Office

New York State has been seeking Federal approval for a waiver for Grades 3 through 8 testing, as well as Regents examinations. To date, this request has not been granted. On Monday the Board of Regents took several measures in the event their continued effort to obtain a waiver from the Federal Government is not fruitful.

These measures include the following:

With regards to Regents examinations, only the following four would be administrated in June:

- Algebra I
- Earth Science
- Living Environment
- EL/

For Grades 3-8 testing in ELA, Math and Science, the following would occur:

- Only Session 1 of the assessments in Math and ELA are required to be administered.
- For Grades 4 and 8 Science, there would be a single session written test and no performance test component.

Principals from all Grades 3 through 12 will be in communication with parents shortly. Students, whose families opted for full remote learning, are not required to take state exams, but do have the option to do so and would coordinate that with the school. The district will continue to respect all parents' preferences with regarding to 3-8 testing.
