School Board Notes – A Message from the Board of Education

The Budget Adoption presentation concluded last evening with the Board of Education adopting the 2021/2022 budget of \$184,937,763 that includes a historical and significant increase in State Aid and a tax levy of .99%. The original executive state-aid proposal was \$39,510,899 with the legislative budget providing \$46,421,675—an increase of \$6,910,776 from the Governor's original proposal. Included within the budget is the purchase of 2 large buses and 2 minivans, additional academic pandemic response positions, a reduction in the use of District reserves, technology upgrades and enhancements, as well as much needed capital projects.

Board President Nicholas Ciappetta announced the three candidates running for the three available board trustee seats—Incumbents Edward J. Nitkewicz and Linda O. LaCara have submitted their candidate petitions, as has Mrs. Erin Meijer, a resident and parent in the District who has served on the Audit Committee for several years. Mr. Ciappetta thanked Board trustee Michele DeGaetano for her devoted service to the District these past nine years, as her term concludes June 30, 2021.

While reviewing the District owned properties currently for sale, Mr. Ciappetta announced the removal of the Chichester Road property



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895 Walt Whitman Rd. Melvile, NY 11747 Phone: (631) 271-1180 from the market. At this time the decision is to maintain the property as open space. The sale of the Teen Center property and the Central Softball Field will appear on the May 18th ballot for the public's approval to move forward. The Teen Center is being sold for approximately \$910,000 and the Central Softball Field for \$800,000. Proceeds from these property sales will be used for safety, security and infrastructure upgrades throughout the District.

The Board would like to remind residents and staff of the Public Hearing of the 2021/2022 budget on May 11, 2021, at 7:30 p.m. in the Leadership Conference Room of the James Kaden Administrative Offices.
