News from Assistant Superintendent for Business and District Operations Dr. Vito D'Elia

In the ongoing effort to keep our students safe, Suffolk County has launched the "School Bus Stop Arm Program." This program equips Suffolk County School District buses, as well as contracted buses, such as Educational Bus, Inc., and Suffolk Transportation, Inc., with an automatic camera. The camera takes pictures when a vehicle passes a school bus while the stop sign is active. Passing a school bus while the stop sign is active is a violation of the "Stop Arm Law." (Section 1174 and 1174a NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law)

As of *May 1, 2021*, tickets will be issued to any vehicle passing a school bus with the stop arm engaged. This program is run by Suffolk County. The bus driver, school districts, and contractors, have no


Athletic News

News from Dr. Gayle Steele, Principal of Maplewood Intermediate School


Welcome back everyone! We hope you all had a wonderful holiday and restful break. It's nice to see our students ready to learn.





News from Dr. Annie Michaelian, Principal of Oakwood Primary Center






