#### K-5 Summer Learning Program

This summer the district is offering a K-5 Summer Learning Program to all South Huntington students. The summer program will be offered through both in-person learning and remote learning options. The program takes place mornings, from Monday, July 12th - Tuesday, August 17th (holiday-no classes: July 19th, 20th). <u>Transportation is available for all students in the program for this summer.</u>

This program is designed to address the "unfinished learning" as a result of the pandemic, and is intended to reinforce basic reading skills and strategies that are essential for students to maintain during the summer as they prepare for the new school year. Math support will also be provided. This will enable students to explore mathematical concepts and literacy in mathematics.

A letter to all families has been mailed to further explain the details of the program, and should be arriving in mail boxes soon, if not already received. If you have not received the mailing, please contact your school's main office.
