We look forward to this next chapter in our district's rich history, and plan to use every minute of available time ensuring success.


News from Deputy Superintendent/Business Dr. Joseph Centamore in the Curriculum Office

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

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
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opportunity to offer this program to all of our elementary students, as this year we are able to provide transportation. The administrative team for the Summer Learning Program is:

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


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News from Information Technology, Reanna Fulton

Incoming Sixth Grade families: Please watch your mailboxes for two Silas Summer Mailings - - one towards the end of July and then an-

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

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
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News from Mr. William Hender, Principal of Maplewood Intermediate School

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
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



The Board of Education is appreciative of all of our staff members who are involved with the district's summer camps and academic summer programs--the pictures featured on our Instagram and Facebook ac-







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
