News from Deputy Superintendent/Business Dr. Joseph Centamore Facilities

The health and safety of our students and staff is always paramount. With this in mind, our Facilities Department is actively putting the finishing touches on their cleaning and maintenance efforts, as we welcome back our staff on Monday, and our students on Wednesday. We thank the department for their outstanding efforts this summer. Extensive daily cleaning protocols will remain in effect all school year. Parking lot drainage upgrades at Birchwood and Maplewood have occurred, and the new Stimson parking lot is being readied for use. All classrooms will continue to utilize air scrubbers with a MERV-16 rating. These devices are also being placed in areas such as the cafeterias. To promote more outdoor activity, and to expand the footprint of our cafeterias during the lunch periods, tents are being provided at all schools.

Transportation

Bus passes are being mailed this week. District as well as contract service bus drivers are performing their practice runs. Like our schools, health and safety remains a focus and protocols will continue to be in place. Being responsive to our community is a priority. News from Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction, Dr. John Murphy and Dr. Gayle Steele Academic Recovery Plan

In an effort to assist parents and students with the learning gap presented over the last 18 months, the South Huntington School District is implementing a plan that will allow students to be provided needed support and remediation to lessen those gaps. As we progress this year, we ask parents to please keep a lookout for information from their child's school regarding new learning opportunities and extracurricular programs that will assist them in building on their current skill sets. In addition to this, Walt Whitman High School was recently provided the opportunity to implement learning labs in all four core subject areas. These learning labs will not only assist those students identified as being in need of academic services, it will also be open to all students who are struggling with current coursework during their lunch periods. We will continue to provide more information as it becomes available.

I-Ready, ThinkCERCA and Albert IO

South Huntington School District is proud to announce three programs that will assist us in our academic recovery efforts, providing needed tutorials and benchmarking to assess current student understanding. I-Ready Math, ThinkCERCA and Albert IO are three programs specifically designed to address learning gaps presented during this pandemic.

The program I-Ready Math is a diagnostic program that allows teachers and schools to effectively assess the current comprehension levels of students within the current math curriculum. The I-Ready program has been utilized as an assessment measure within the South Huntington Schools, grades kindergarten through eighth grade. While this will continue, the information collected will be utilized with greater efficacy to address and model current instructional practices.

With regards to THINKCerca and Albert IO, these programs are specifically used at the secondary level for English and Social Studies. Both of these programs provide students and parents the opportunity to complete lessons and assignments, both at home and in the classroom, utilizing a digital platform focused on student deficiencies in understanding and retention. Albert IO not only provides these services to students struggling, but also is a phenomenal learning platform at all levels of learning (Regents, Advanced Placement, College-Level). We ask all parents to please continue to be on the lookout for further information regarding these three programs during the upcoming year to better assist their child.

ParentSquare/IC Parent Portal for Student Attendance

While both students and parents are overloved at the prospect of returning to a traditional learning environment, student attendance has become problematic. While the last 18 months certainly gave reason for many of these absences, there is a definitive need for the district to focus their efforts on combating student attendance issues and providing support for parents on the benefits of their child attending school regularly. One of the programs brought in by the South Huntington School District to address this issue is ParentSquare. ParentSquare is a communication device that not only allows the district to send out information to a variety of groups, it also allows a constant flow of communication between teachers, students, and parents. In addition to this, ParentSquare will be utilized by each school to communicate daily student attendance to keep parents informed. This will work in combination with the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, providing the most up-to-date and accurate information to parents. It is our hope that this additional resource will allow our students to transition back to a traditional school setting. We ask that all parents continue to utilize the IC Parent Por-



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tal to look up attendance and current academic coursework, while also utilizing ParentSquare to communicate with their child's teachers. Current Curriculum Initiatives: Kindergarten to 5th Grade

At the Elementary level, South Huntington has been planning professional development opportunities for staff as we roll into our academic recovery phase. Throughout the year, teachers will be participating in workshops that will enhance instruction in all the K-5 content areas outlined below.

<u>ELA</u>

We will continue to support teachers with the Balanced Literacy Approach to Instruction in K-5 classrooms. This approach to instruction allows for learning opportunities through interactive read-alouds, reading and writing mini-lessons, shared reading, phonics, spelling and word study. Students will engage in conversation about their reading and writing as they deepen their understanding of different instructional contexts.

Mathematics

We are in the second year of our implementation of the I-Ready Mathematics program. (Formerly known as Ready Class Mathematics). Students will continue to have opportunities to be engaged in rigorous opportunities that will build their conceptual understanding and procedural fluency. Teachers will support students in discourse- driven routines as they collaborate, discuss and clarify strategies with their peers.

Science

Students will continue to be engaged in scientific discovery through the Amplify Science Program. This program allows for hands-on investigation with literacy-rich activities. Students will read, write and think about different scientific phenomena, and be empowered to think like scientists and engineers.

Social Studies

We will continue to utilize the Integrated Social Studies/ELA Curriculum provided by Putnam Northern Westchester BOCES. This curriculum is based on the NYSED Social Studies Framework.

We are excited about these opportunities to foster a strong learning environment for our students and look forward to a great year!
