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
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News from Dr. James Wright, Supervisor of Physical Education, Health, Athletics & Recreation

We look forward to our students embracing the year ahead with all that the South Huntington Arts' Program offers!


News from Mr. John Murphy, Principal of Walt Whitman High School



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

We have also implemented the following new procedures for our arrival and dismissal in an effort to minimize congestion and allow for social distancing:

Arrival: New signage has been added to locations at the entrance marking the drop-off point for students. In order to better manage social distancing at the front door, we are asking parents to drop students off at the entrance to the parking lot. Staff will be present in this location to assist.

Dismissal: Students taking the bus will be dismissed by grade in order to load buses from back to front. Students being picked up will be dismissed by grade at designated doors on the side of the building. Please send a note to your child's teacher indicating that your child is being picked up. If this will be a daily practice, please state that in your letter. Parents will not be allowed in the building to get passes to pick up their child. Anyone picking up a child will be asked to park and walk to the side of the building where students will be dismissed. Each grade will dismiss from a different entrance to allow for social-distancing. Signs will be posted by each exit. We ask that you be patient with us, as this is a new procedure, but it will allow us to avoid the congestion that usually occurs in the front of the building.

Thank you to the PTA for the festive Welcome Back to School sign that was on our front lawn for the first two days of school. Also, thank you to the PTA for the delicious welcome back breakfast they provided for the staff. It was a fabulous way to end the first week, and a nice reminder of the importance of the partnership between home and school. We appreciate your support and look forward to a great school year.



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
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The Board of Education Statement regarding **Dr. Bennardo's Retirement**
