Office of Curriculum & Instruction

We are extremely excited to welcome everyone back to school for the 2021-2022 school year. It has been an exciting summer to say the least, getting the information and protocols necessary to have all our students return to full in-person learning. As we have traveled the district, looking at the various buildings to ensure that they are ready, we are happy to say that the classrooms look fabulous and that the schools have come to life with excitement as we all embark on this journey towards academic recovery. We truly hope that each and every student finds success this year and





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promise to provide the necessary support and encouragement for this to occur. We here at South Huntington are determined to provide students every opportunity to succeed.

iReady testing in September: K-8 Grade

As we return to some normalcy within our traditional school structure, all students, K-8, will take the Fall iReady Diagnostic within the first few weeks of school. These results, along with other classroom assessments/observations, will provide teachers with important data regarding each child's academic levels. This will help guide classroom instruction and individualized instruction as we move through the curriculum, allowing us to pinpoint student deficiencies and make sure that teachers' lessons focus on areas of need. Given that every school is different with their implementation of the iReady testing, additional information for each grade will be shared at the Curriculum Nights at each school.

Program Orientations/Curriculum Nights in September

It is our pleasure to announce that our elementary buildings will be holding their annual Curriculum Nights during the month of September. Parents/ Guardians have the option of attending Curriculum Nights in person or virtually. Those parents that will be participating virtually will receive an email from their child's school providing the sign-on procedures. For those attending in person, we will be following the CDC guidelines for social distancing, which is a minimum of 3 feet of distance between each individual. Therefore, we ask that families try to limit the number of in-person attendees to one parent/guardian per student.

<u>ParentSquare/IC Parent Portal for Student Attendance</u>
While the last 18 months certainly gave reason for many of these absences, there is a definitive need for the district to focus their efforts on combating student attendance issues and providing support for parents on the benefits of their child attending school regularly. One of the programs brought in by the South Huntington School District to address this issue is ParentSquare. ParentSquare is a communication device that not only allows the district to send out information to a variety of groups, it also allows a constant flow of communication between teachers, students and parents. In addition to this, ParentSquare will be utilized by each school to communicate daily student attendance to keep parents informed. This will work in combination with the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, providing the most up-to-date and accurate information to parents. It is our hope that this additional resource will allow our students to transition back to a traditional school setting. We ask that all parents continue to utilize the IC Parent Portal to look up attendance and current academic coursework, while also utilizing ParentSquare to communicate with their child's teachers. 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



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


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#### A CHILD'S ENVIRONMENT IS IMPORTANT!

It is official, school is open, and we are off to a great start. It was especially nice to see all of our students and staff return to full instruction. It has been a long road thus far, but we are hopeful that brighter school days lie ahead. We understand that the first couple of days have been challenging during arrival in the morning, and I assure you we are working to streamline the process on a regular basis. We are encouraging our students to utilize district transportation, since this would limit the traffic coming onto campus. If you choose to drive your student to campus, please use the student dropoff area at the base of Paumonok Drive or in front of the North Gym.

For those students who were unable to attend the Freshman/Sophomore Orientation in August, we will set aside several dates over the next couple of weeks where students can create their own Class of 2025/2024 T-shirt.

In order for our Seniors and Juniors with a valid Class D to park on campus and obtain a parking sticker, they must be in possession of a valid New York State Class D License, and submit the parking permission slip to security or Mrs. Hirsch-Beckman. A parking sticker will be issued once we have a copy of a valid Class D license and the permission slip. You can obtain a parking sticker either before school starting at 7 am, OR during your lunch periods. Any student with a junior license or Class DJ will not be permitted to drive on campus. If you park illegally on campus with a Class DJ license, you may have your parking sticker suspended for a full academic quarter once your license turns into a NYS Class D Senior License. Please be aware starting on Friday, September 9, 2021 students without a parking sticker will no longer be allowed to park on campus. After September 10, 2021 you will have to come and retrieve a parking sticker packet (located in the main office). After your packet is reviewed by Ms. Hirsch-Beckman, you will be contacted for your sticker.

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

Our Kindergarten orientation was a huge success at Oakwood Primary Cen-












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

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## School Board Notes – A Message from the Board of Education

While we begin this school year with COVID-19 still at the forefront of our minds, it is critical to note that Wednesday, September 1st, was the first time that we had a "traditional" school day since March of 2020. These past eighteen months have challenged us like never before, but our school district always rises to the occasion, and this pandemic provided us another opportunity to demonstrate our resiliency and toughness. While we will be providing solely in-person instruction, we continue to take every precaution and spare no expense to establish a safe work and learning environment.

As we begin anew, our district welcomes new faces and familiar faces to new places. That change begins at the top with our first new superintendent in nearly a decade and continues throughout our school administration and faculty and staff. We have new cabinet members, principals and assistant principals, dozens of first-year teachers and support staff. While the turnover may be greater than in previous years, the expectations are as lofty as ever, and our commitment to excellence remains unparalleled.

We are, however, not immune to the challenges posed by the interrupted learning environment of the past eighteen months. This impact also extends beyond academics to the mental health and well-being of our students. South Huntington is not alone in the need to provide remediation, but few districts are prepared to attack the unfinished learning challenge as aggressively. The Board of Education, with the support of our community, has devoted unprecedented resources to ensure that the pandemic does not produce a new achievement gap. Indeed, at our next Board of Education meeting scheduled for September 9, 2021, Dr. Vito D'Elia and his team will detail an ambitious plan to address the varied consequences of unfinished learning.

However, no plan can be implemented without the support of each of our hundreds of employees. Our facility and staff remain our most important and valuable resource, and we need to rely on their expertise more than ever. We assure you that these challenges will be met with laser-like focus on the mission and goal.
