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

This is a reminder to all parents about the district's use of the new communication system, ParentSquare. ParentSquare is a communication device that not only allows the district to send out information to a variety of groups, it also allows a constant flow of communication between teachers, students and parents. In addition to this, ParentSquare will be utilized by each school to communicate daily student attendance to keep parents informed. This will work in combination with the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, providing the most up-to-date and accurate information to parents. It is our hope that this additional resource will allow our students to transition back to a traditional school setting. We ask that all parents continue to utilize the IC Parent Portal to look up attendance and current academic coursework, while also utilizing ParentSquare to communicate with

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

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












News from Mr. William Hender, Principal of Maplewood Intermediate School

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



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
