Walt Whitman High School is proud to report that just under 80% of our students who participated in the Advanced Placement program earned college-level credit on the 2020 AP exams. It's remarkable to note that, despite the increased AP class enrollment, which has hundreds more students participating in college classes, the overall credit percentage continues to climb, as more of our young men and women "rise to the occasion" and prove ready to embrace college-level work.

We are also pleased to announce that the Grade Book feature in the Parent Portal is being rolled out for students in grades 6 through 12. Students and parents will now be able to view posted, graded assignments, and homework progress. This "real time" information will replace the traditional progress reports. Parents can access Grade Book by signing into their Infinite Campus Portal account and find the menu *Assignments* and *Grade Book Updates*, which are now visible. *Assignments* gives a list of all student projects as





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they are assigned. Grade Book Updates is a listing of assignments and their scores.

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

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


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News from Mr. Eddie Smith, Principal of Stimson Middle School
