Creating a College List

“Finding a good college fit begins with identifying places that provide the academic program you need and a style of instruction that is most comfortable for you.”

- Use Naviance & College Board to find potential colleges.
 - College Visits
 - College Fairs (October 16th - Per. 2 & 3)
 - Open House (Virtual or In-Person)

- Likely / Target / Reach Schools
 - Students should use **data** from schools to determine if it is a likely, target, or reach.



Application Components

- Application
- High School Transcript (GPA, class size)
 - Senior Year Schedule / Mid-year grades
- Standardized Test Scores
 - Test Optional Policies
- Personal Statement
 - Utilize writing labs during lunch to revise it - 617A
- Supplemental essay (if required)
- Activities, Clubs, Honors, Community Service
- SRAR (if required)

 - SUNY Application (i.e. Farmingdale, Stony Brook, Geneseo)
 - CUNY Application (i.e. Queens College, Baruch)
 - Institutional Applications
 - Coalition Application

- Early Decision is **BINDING**
 - Early Action
 - Regular Decision
 - Rolling Admissions

Community College

- Suffolk and Nassau Community College are local schools that offer Associate's Degrees (2-year)
- Application Process
 - How is it different from the four year college process?
- You can earn an associate's degree based on a career outcome.
 - HVAC
 - Radiology Technician
 - Auto-Mechanic
 - LPN, Physical Therapy Assistant

Financial Aid

- Institutional Scholarships:
 - Merit Based: Based on academic records
 - Other: Military, Leadership, Community Service, etc.
- Whitman Exclusives Scholarships
- Scholarship Databases
 - Naviance
 - www.FastWeb.com
- Financial Aid **need** based (overall family income)
 - FAFSA, TAP, Excelsior
 - NYS DREAM Act (undocumented students)

- Never rule out a college because of cost alone. Compare costs before applying
 - Net price calculators can provide an estimate of financial aid eligibility and remaining college costs.
- Compare awards – look at grants, loans, and parental contributions before making a final decision on a college.
- You will receive your financial aid package approximately 4-6 weeks after being accepted.
